

## **APPENDIX 2: Illustrations relating to the history of the area**




An engraving by Sutton Nicholl's showing Covent Garden built up by 1720.

The view stretches up from the Piazza to St. Giles, long before Shaftesbury Avenue was cut through in the 1880's as a philanthropic act of vandalism and community displacement.

It shows the proposed destruction of two thirds of the area to make way for 4 lane roads, multi-storey car parks and the displacement of the old community.
